## An Overview of Testing

- I'll let you summarize the key points from the reading.

## Using Our Testing Environment

- First, load the testing environment

```
(load "/home/rebelsky/Web/Courses/CS151/2006F/Examples/unit-test.ss")
```

- Next, load the file that you're testing

```
(load file-to-test)
```

- Next, start the test suite

```
(begin-tests!)
```

- Next, run the individual tests

```
(test! expression-to-test expected-value)  
(test-error! expression-that-should-fail)  
...
```

- Finally, end the suite

(end-tests!)
