This codebook is for the version of the 200x Grinnell College “College Students Beliefs and Values” data provided to students in MAT/SST 115.03 2008S. The codebook was initially provided to Sam Rebelsky by Katherine McClelland and appears to be a modified version of the standard CIRP/CSBV codebook provided by the Higher Education Research Institute. Sam made a few more modifications, including adding this introduction.

The codebook has two parts: CIRP data (traditional questions for first-year students) and a Spirituality Survey.
